



NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP

Goran Micevski / 2006 / 4:00 min. The video shows two upper halves of the body of a naked man (the artist) shot from bird's-eye perspective and edited to meet each other in the middle of a bed. At first glance it looks as if this is an image and its reflection in the mirror, only to turn out that these are two halves of the same whole, trying in vain to

get rid of one another. Goran Micevski graduated photography at the Faculty of Applied Arts in Belgrade, Serbia. Micevski has taken part in several group exhibitions and has had numerous solo shows in Serbia and abroad.

CLAY PIGEON / Milos Tomic / 2005 / 6:41 min.

A love game is interrupted by serious events but the lovers don't want to finish their game.

Born in Belgrade in 1976, Milos Tomic studied film direction and animation in Belgrade, Praga, Berlin, and Madrid. www.milostomic.com

ATOMIC WATCH / Nenad Kostic / 2006 / 1:13 min.

Atomic Watch represents one minute of time, within the frame of nuclear destruction. A clock whose arrow is a ballistic missile, changing different types with every second. These are technical drawings so they also have the length of one meter beside them. Atomic Watch deals with time and space (two dimensions defining our existence) in their basic measures, and with the fact that they are as instable as uranium inside nuclear warheads.

Nenad Kostic was born in Belgrade. Kostic completed two years on the MFA program at the Academy of Art University, San Francisco in the 2D animation department. His work has been exhibited in numerous group and solo shows in Europe and the USA. He is represented by Art Zone 461 Gallery, San Francisco.

FPS (FIRST PERSON SHOOTERS OR FRAMES PER SECOND) / Wim Janssen /2006 / 3:08 min.

In FPS a shoot'em up computer is simulated with Super-8 cameras. Two contenders try to locate each other in their field of view and fire. The game last as long as a roll of film. The result is projected side-to-side in a form that resembles the interface of a multi-player game.

Wim Janssen lives and works in Belgrade and Antwerp. He studied experimental film at Saint Lukas Hogeschool, Brussels. Janssen makes film, video and installation art. His work often focuses on the strategies and technologies of vision.

BIG BANG / Bojana Romic / 2009 / 2:30 min.

The choreography of one drop of water against the eye's surface.

Bojana Romic is an artist and theoretician currently based in Belgrade. Romic's theoretical research concerns the problem of authorship on Web 2.0 applications such as YouTube and Wikipedia, and she has been involved in several international projects focused on long-distance learning and media literacy, Romic is currently a member of the AVE network, working as a curator of video art.

EXHAUSTION OF EUROPE / Jovan Cekic / 2005 / 8:07 min. The video questions the extent to which global changes and political events, even in regions geographically close to us, affect the everyday life of ordinary people.

Artist and theoretician Jovan Cecik is author of the book, "Cutting Through the Chaos."

AMERIKA / Ane Lan / 2003 / 3:15 min.

In this idiosyncratic short video, Amerika, Norwegian artist Ane Lan, dressed as a woman in Middle Eastern attire, reclines in an Orientalist setting while singing: "America, America, where are you now?"

Ane Lan was born in Oslo, Norway in 1972. He graduated from the National College of Art and design in Oslo in 2002 and is working in the field of performance, music and experimental film/video. He has participated in various international exhibitions; The Whitney Museum of American Art, NYC, Paco das Artes, Sao Paolo, the 51st Venice Biennial and the 10th Istanbul Biennial. CHE GUEVARA'S ROLEX / Birgitte Sigmundstad / 2009 / 4: 40 min. A picture of Che Guevara with his Rolex was used in the magazine "Watch Time". This led to enormous reactions from readers, both positive and negative. Their posts about this footnote in our recent history unexpectedly became a micro-cosmos wherein the sense of justice, freedom of expression and commercialism are fighting for attention.

BULL.MILETIC is Synne Bull (Norwegian, b. 1973) and Dragan Miletic (American, b. Yugoslavia, 1970). Central to their artistic practice is the question of how reality is perceived through moving images. OPACITY / Farhad Kalantary / 2005 / 5:30 min.

Opacity is a short 16mm film exploring the surrounded fear of an interior space. "Fear is omnipresent and there is nowhere to hide". Opacity is about such crisis of interiority. It finds itself on the borders of color and B/W and on the constant shift of exposures between under and over exposed film and generates its own unstable conditions of visibility. The film borrows sound from several movies such as Seven, Psycho and Nostalgia, whose traces are barely recognizable. With tensions of the space and the absence of inhabitants, Opacity brings about an action-thriller film without the people.

Farhad Kalantary (Tabriz, Iran, 1962) is a visual artist working primarily with non-narrative films and video installations. He has studied at San Francisco State University (BA, 1992) and San Francisco Art Institute (MFA, 1996) and he is now based in Oslo, Norway. His works have been shown in various international film festivals as well as in galleries and museums in the US and Europe, and they are part of the collections of Moderna Museet, Stockholm, and the Arts Council Norway. ERASE / Margarida Paiva / 2009 / 3:30 min.

With: Sigrid H. Kopperdal and Sound Design: Øyvind Blikstad. Erase is an image-poem that touches on themes such as loss and displacement. Distant sounds are counter-pointed with images of walking ghosts in a white landscape.

Margarida Paiva was born in Portugal in 1975, currently living and working in Oslo. Paiva studied at the Faculty of Fine Arts in Oporto and at the Academy of Fine Arts in Oslo. Her video works are based on fragmented stories that explore inner states of mind, resembling dreams and memories. Melancholy, loneliness and fear are subjects that always remain in these works and are expressed through poetic imagery. www.margaridapaiva.net

FELIX CULPA, A HANDMADE MASSACRE

Martin Skauen / 2007 / 5:06 min.

The video is like an animated Judgement Day - a grotesque and violent universe where people are divided into two categories; those who eat and those who are eaten...! With his distinctive technique Skauen leads the camera across the large-scale drawing and create the illusion of movement in a never-ending claustrophobic room. In Felix Culpa, Skauen has created a frightening dark and self-annihilating world - a world totally out of order, inhabited by the most primitive and destructive forces.

SONG ARCHIVE / Yvonne Buchheim / 2009 / 5:00 min.

Yvonne Buchheim explores contemporary song culture in a visual art context. Her ongoing Song Archive Project acts as a framework to question cultural belief values while playfully suggesting the complexity of identities through song. Her art practice incorporates a variety of media, ranging from video, site-specific installation, performance to live art.

Yvonne Buchheim has recently received a publication award from arts organization Safle, Wales, for the Song Archive Project and the book will be launched in 2011. Previously she has been awarded artist residencies and commissions in the UK, Ireland, France, Germany, USA and Iran. The artist used self-hypnosis in an attempt to free himself from the force of gravity; the result of this experiment, Weightless, is the uncovering of two opposing, highly charged and deeply engaging emotional states.

A HARD PLACE / Ronnie Close / 2009 / 4:54 min.

A Hard Place explores the construction of history by drawing on the mythological dimension of Irish political martyrdom in the 1981 Hunger Strikes. Filmed on the eve of the traditional 12th July Bonfires in Belfast this material has been transformed into an apocalyptic reading of place.

Ronnie Close's practice creates a series of political-aesthetic visual works that stimulate engagement with the problems of the present. The art practice visually responds to historical incidents in order to disrupt meaning and the sense of cohesion amongst competing if latent beliefs. This asks questions of what we know and how we think we know it, as means to discuss consciousness and the *limits of knowledge itself. www.ronnieclose.com*

CURTAIN / Peter Bobby / 2009 / 4.52 min. extract (HD Video)

In many respects the event captured in Curtain is somewhat mundane: the closing and opening of a curtain at first denying us of the view out, then authorizing us to look again. Scale, colour, formalist shapes, references to theatre and the room's position at the top of a high-rise building all draw the viewer in to observe the scene in intimate detail and question the relationship between the interior and exterior space.

SON OF KING / Julia Zastava / 2008 / 4.29 min. Music by ALOG

Son of king is about the boundary state of a dream. This animation was made from my photos of Count Orlov's palace (Orlov, one of the favorites of Catherine the Great), one of the largest palaces in the suburbs of Moscow. Like almost all other palaces in Russia, after the revolution of 1917 it was harried then abandoned. Now it is nearly a ruin but still very majestic, and I find it tremendously mystical. It is like a fantastic swooning of the XVIII century.

LITTLE BLACK / Nikolay Kurbatsky / 2008 / 1.51 min. Video and sound by Nikolay Kurbatsky. Text by Jean-Paul Sartre.

Reading by Irina Erisanova.

This work is based on a short text excerpt from the novel "Nausea" by French writer and philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre. The novel depicts the occasional meeting of a man and woman on the street, but in the video I tried to explore and show the constant, bizarre conflicts of relationships in everyday life. Violence, racial problems, disturbing misunderstandings between men and women and between people in general.

Born in Tomsk in 1982, Nikolay Kurbatsky studied at Moscow State University, Faculty of Journalism and Tambov State University, Faculty of Public Relations. Degree of candidate of science in Russian literature. Kurbatsky's work has been included in several group exhibitions in Moscow and St. Petersburg.

I WANT TO LIVE THROUGH YOUR DEATH Olga Jitlina / 2009 / 5.44 min.

Vertigo/Kirill Shuvalov.

My video is a reenactment of my Mom's suicide, 10 years after her death. I woke up very early the morning of March 23rd 2009 and went with the camera from my bed to the balcony from where my mother threw herself: I tried to look through her eyes and capture the last thing that she saw in her life. By telling this personal yet at the same time common story of a middle-aged person in Russia in the 1990's, I aim not to provoke a sense of pity or frustration, but rather to share my experience of living through the trauma of loss, saying it is hard but possible.

STORAGE / Anton Hlabov / 2009 / 2.20 min.

We live in a world where the amount of processors and microchips produced each year contains a number of transistors one hundred times higher than population of ants on our planet. The density of the artificial system in different communication devices and instruments everywhere surrounding us allows us to consider the operations and processes occurring inside them as a certain micro-space, where our everyday actions such as checking e-mail or sending SMS are reflected by multiple events and metamorphoses. The plot of the video develops from the rhythmically pulsating sound of a dial-up modem, a reminder of the work of a life support system. We gradually see a materialization of those pulses linking scattered moments of time, stretching over a line, connecting callers to the unknown device where all the actions go on.

Photographer and multimedia artist Anton Hlabov was born in St. Petersburg in 1986. Since 2005 Hlabov has been studying New Technologies in Modern Art at Institute Pro Arte. His work has been included in: Festival "OutVideo `06", the parallel program of festival SITM (2007), the parallel program of 2nd Moscow Biennial, in the video-program "the Glass field", Avanto Festival 07, Kiasma (Helsinki).

EXPULSION FROM PARADISE

Andrey Ustinov / 2003 / 2.01 min.

This is a video-documentation of an action that took place on May 1st, 2002 in a McDonald's restaurant in St. Petersburg. This action is a radical expropriation of all goods turned into capital by our civilization. The action was directed as a remake of a biblical plot. Artists, like Adam and Eve, are walking in the "garden" of McDonald's and "tasting" its fruits, collecting meals from the tables of the visitors. The furious visitors exile the couple from "Paradise".

Andrey Ustinov was born in Luga, Leningrad area. Studied in St. Petersburg: Theatrical Academy; State Academy of Art and Design, in Humanitarian Academy, branches of the Linguistics and Psychologies; finished "New technologies in modern art" course at Institute Pro Arte. Currently a student of the High School Art Kunsthochschule Kassel, Germany. Ustinov works with comics and video installation. Ustinov 's work has been exhibited at the Short Cinema Festivals Oberhausen51/Germany 2005, 'Blicke aus Ruhrgebiet', Bochum/Germany 2005. "Expulsion from Paradise" was awarded the prize for best video performance at Independent cinema festival TROMANALE, Berlin, 2005.

FEEDBACK / Maksim Svishev / 2009 / 5:42 min.

Feedback is a story about a person's relationship to the self. Girls film each other on camera. They look alike, one is a reflection of the other. That is to say, each removes itself. Stereotypes and social stamps are making individuals behave like mechanisms deprived of identity. External and internal noises, flashing images of everyday life thrown into personal internal space, all leading people astray from the inner self.
